VACCINATION CLINIC – APRIL 9

The Johnson and Johnson single dose vaccine will be available. If you have traveled and missed getting your second dose of Moderna, this is your opportunity to get it. If you know anyone who is homebound or needs assistance, please call and PMC will arrange safe delivery of a vaccine.

PETERSBURG BOROUGH PUBLIC HEALTH MANDATE #06 - SUBMISSION OF TRAVEL PLANS

Any business intending to bring or send workers into the Petersburg Borough must submit a protective plan to the EOC for review and comment. Submit your plan by email to: eoc@petersburgak.gov.

TRAVELERS – TAKE A FREE FOLLOW UP TEST

All travelers returning to Petersburg are strongly encouraged to take a free follow-up COVID-19 test 5-14 days after returning to Petersburg. If you opt to take a follow-up test sign in to the State of Alaska Travel Portal <u>alaska.covidsecureapp.com</u> and choose the "Generate travel voucher". WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS OF COVID?

Difficulty breathing, cough, fever, runny nose, headache, sore throat, body aches, diarrhea, rash, loss of appetite, loss of sense of smell or taste, or sudden onset of any unexplained symptom. RENTAL EVICTION MORATORIUM EXTENDED

The federal government extended an order which is intended to temporarily halt residential evictions as a result of COVID-19. This eviction moratorium was enacted through the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to prevent further spread of COVID-19. The order makes it illegal to evict any individual who qualifies, and allows tenants to stay in their housing through June 30, 2021. Businesses, non-profits or other organizations that would like to obtain masks for distribution to the public can email their request to eoc@petersburgak.gov.


