ARE YOU READY TO GET VACCINATED?

April 9th will be the next community vaccine clinic. Both the Moderna and Johnson & Johnson vaccines will be available by appointment only. To get on the vaccine waitlist go to <u>www.pmc-ak.org</u> or call 772-5545. If you would prefer to get vaccinated in private, please call 772-5545 to discuss getting vaccinated during a private appointment at the clinic.

WHY VACCINATE?

Choosing to get vaccinated is the single most important action you can take to protect yourself and your community. Until more people are vaccinated and case rates are lower in Alaska, take precautions including wearing a mask, staying six feet apart from others, and avoiding crowds and poorly ventilated spaces. ALL INCOMING TRAVELERS MUST SCREEN AT THE AIRPORT

The screening is required of all travelers, even if you are vaccinated or arrive with a negative test. It is required that all travelers:

- 1. Log on to the state's Travel Portal <u>alaska.covidsecureapp.com</u>
- 2. Fill out a travel declaration form
- 3. Go through the screening tent

UNEMPLOYMENT + 2020 INCOME TAX

For individuals who received unemployment benefits in 2020, the IRS said beginning in May and continuing through the summer, it will automatically issue refunds to eligible people who already filed a tax return reporting unemployment compensation before the recent changes made by the American Rescue Plan Act to exclude \$10,200 of unemployment income from taxes. Under this process, eligible taxpayers will not have to file amended returns to receive a refund. If you have not yet filed your 2020 tax return, the IRS has published guidance on how to exclude the unemployment income here: https://www.irs.gov/faqs/irs-procedures/forms-publications/new-exclusion-of-up-to-10200-of-unemployment-compensation
