WHO'S AT RISK OF SERIOUS ILLNESS FROM COVID-19? MORE PEOPLE THAN YOU MIGHT THINK.

Two out of three Alaska adults have an underlying health condition that can make COVID-19 more serious. The CDC states strong evidence links serious COVID-19 illness with current or former smoking, obesity, diabetes, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), heart disease or heart attacks, and chronic kidney disease. The good news is that many of these health concerns can be managed with changes to nutrition and physical activity, and sometimes medication. However living with an ongoing disease can make it harder for your body to fight viruses like COVID-19.
