HOW CAN YOU HELP OUR COMMUNITY OVERCOME COVID? GET VACCINATED

Community members are encouraged to consider getting the vaccine because it can mean that we keep our loved ones safe, our schools open, get our local businesses back on their feet, and move our community forward. As more people are vaccinated, we can protect health care and essential workers, people who are at highest risk, and our broader community. SPRING BREAK TRAVELERS - HELP KEEP COVID OUT OF PETERSBURG

All travelers entering Petersburg by air or water - including Petersburg residents must:

- 1) Register on the Alaska Travel Portal prior to travel https://www.alaska.covidsecureapp.com
- 2) Test at the airport for free upon arrival or arrive with a negative molecular-based PCR test within 72 hours of departure to Petersburg. Vaccinated individuals are required to test.
- 3) Until negative test results are received: wear face coverings in public, keep social groups small, avoid crowds and keep track of close contacts.
- 4) Take a free follow-up test 5-14 days after arrival.

ASSISTANCE FOR PROVIDING PAID SICK/FAMILY LEAVE TO EMPLOYEES AND SELF-EMPLOYED

Small businesses, self-employed, and certain nonprofits have access to funds to provide employees with paid sick and family and medical leave who were unable to work for reasons related to COVID-19, either for the employee's own health needs or to care for family members. The federal government is covering the cost of this paid leave by providing a refundable tax credit. With a refundable tax credit, the employer will get the full amount of the credit even if it exceeds their tax liability. Employers may claim the credits on their Form 941: Employer's Quarterly Federal Tax Return. Employers can claim credits between April 1, 2020 to September 30, 2021.

LONG TERM CARE VISITS

CMS (Centers for Medicaid and Medicare Services) has provided guidelines for safely opening Long Term Care for visitation. PMC Long Term Care residents along with their loved ones are looking forward to face to face and hand holding visits! Please call 772-5740 to schedule a visit with your loved ones. Visitors will be screened before entering LTC and visitations will be limited to resident's rooms. When the weather improves, outside visits will be scheduled as well.

FREE ASYMPTOMATIC TESTING

The Medical Center is offering free asymptomatic COVID testing at the PMC Respiratory Clinic. Call 907-772-4299. Travelers are encouraged to take advantage of this and do a follow up test 5-10 days after arrival in Petersburg.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS OF COVID?

Difficulty breathing, cough, fever, runny nose, headache, sore throat, body aches, diarrhea, rash, loss of appetite, loss of sense of smell or taste, or sudden onset of any unexplained symptom.
