LOCAL ECONOMIC SUPPORT GRANTS NOW AVAILABLE

The Petersburg Borough announces the availability of \$500,000 in economic support grants for small businesses located in Petersburg, Alaska who suffered economic harm from the COVID-19 public health emergency. Businesses must have been established prior to March 2020, sell goods and services directly to consumers, and have a demonstrable decline in gross sales from the previous year. CIVIL EMERGENCY PROVISIONS

Ordinance #2020-19 Amending Borough Code Chapter 3.72 to Provide for Civil Emergency Provisions has been adopted by the Borough Assembly. Provisions of Ordinance #2020-19 take effect immediately. QUESTIONS ABOUT SYMPTOMS OR TEST RESULTS? CALL THE HOTLINE

Anyone with even one new symptom of COVID-19 (fever, chills, cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle aches, body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion, runny nose, nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea), even if it is very mild, should get tested for COVID-19 right away. Tests are most accurate in the first few days of symptoms, and if the test is positive, getting tested right away helps contact tracers move as quickly as possible.
