Thank you for your interest in joining the Petersburg Volunteer Fire Department. The department would not exist if not for people like you who are willing to step up and make a difference in people's lives and this community.

The Petersburg Volunteer Fire Department is actually two (2) different organizations: The **Petersburg Volunteer Fire Department** (PVFD) and the **Petersburg Volunteer Fire Department Association**. When you join, you will be joining both. PVFD is the operational side of the department. This side provides the direction, oversite and policy for response to emergencies and provides skills training to the emergency responders. The Association is the social organization side which provides support for the members through incentives, outside training opportunities and fun social events. The Association also builds community support for the entire organization through public events that promote the Petersburg Volunteer Fire Department as a whole.

The Petersburg Volunteer Fire Department was established in 1911 and is currently comprised of 3 branches: Fire, Emergency Medical Services (EMS), and Search and Rescue (SAR). We are dedicated to life safety and the protection of property.

Fire Branch

<u>Training (Drill):</u> Second, third, and fourth Thursdays of every month from 7:00 – 9:00 P.M. Additional

training may be available throughout the year and/or upon request. Emergency Response: Carry a pager and respond if you are available.

EMS Branch

<u>Pre-requisite:</u> You must have a current Alaska Emergency Medical Services certification (i.e. Emergency Trauma Technician or Emergency Medical Technician) OR be enrolled in a class.

<u>Training (Drill)</u>: Second and fourth Wednesday of every month from 7:00 – 9:00 P.M. Additional training may be available throughout the year and/or upon request.

<u>Emergency Response:</u> We request you sign up for seven (7) shifts. Each shift is 12 hours long. Day shift is from 6:00 A.M. – 6:00 P.M. and Night shift is from 6:00 P.M. – 6:00 A.M. You are required to carry a pager and remain within 5 minutes of Station 1 while on shift.

SAR Branch

<u>Pre-requisite:</u> No prior knowledge, skill, or ability required. <u>Training Officer:</u> Patrick Fowler (fowler.patrick@gmail.com)

<u>Training (Drill):</u> Second and fourth Tuesday of every month from 6:00 – 8:00 P.M. Additional training

may be available throughout the year and/or upon request.

Emergence Response: You will be notified via telephone and requested to respond if you are available.

In addition to the training offered, the Association and Department have meetings on the First Thursday of every month at 7:00 P.M. at Station 1. We ask that you attend the meetings. Dinner is provided at 6:00 P.M. (location to be determined) if you want to eat with the group.

We understand that life is busy (family, work, school, volunteering, etc) and your time is limited. Maybe your job requires you to be away from town frequently and/or for long periods of time. Maybe your boss will not allow you to leave work. Do not let your busy schedule deter you from becoming a volunteering with PVFD. We currently have members from all walks of life: fishermen, Forest Service employees, self-employed business owners, hospital employees, small business employees, retired persons, etc. We just ask that you participate when you can.

There are many benefits from joining the Petersburg Volunteer Fire Department. You will become part of our family. You will be providing an amazing service to your community. You may be eligible for the many incentives offered by the Association and Borough.
